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Abdominal bloating
Sugar cravings
Alcohol intolerance

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We treated with sugar avoidance A low-yeast/mold diet Caprylic acid (Capricin) Anti-fungals (Nystatin, Diflucan, Sporanox, etc.)

Some doctors using energy testing (kinesiology) would end up giving HUGE amounts of Nystatin.

I started to suspect some other mechanism: maybe leaky gut blocked?

We hunted around for effective tests Candida and yeast skin sensitivity testing was my favorite.

Anti-Candida antibodies (never convinced) ... we have all encountered Candida.

Thing is: WE NEVER FOUND CANDIDA IN OUR PATIENTS! ... Not in any quantity We know it shows up in severe immune compromised patients (cancer, AIDS etc.)

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Finally, we came to the fermentation tests

Simplest was sugar loading (after a fast), followed by blood samples looking for alcohols.

Didn't prove much, except that fermentation was taking place.

The whole story was incredibly shaky...
It was held in place by sometimes dramatic recoveries.

We got the "burn off" reaction, after antifungals, which seemed to reinforce it.

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By the mid-1990s, I was asking "Is this all?" There has to be more to the story...
